### Mission Statement

To provide a quality Montessori education in an environment that encourages a child's love of learning and respect for self, others, community and the world.

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### Principal's Highlights

Silver Sands Montessori had a successful year building on our community partnerships, implementing the school performance goals, and enhancing experiences in Montessori for both students and staff.

- Students from 4th through 8th grade participated in the National Geography Bee. One 8th grade student was a finalist at the State Geography Bee.
- Participated in the Regional Science Fair (24 students, grade levels, 3rd through 8th) that resulted in three Honorable Mentions.

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### Goals and Objectives

#### Goal 1

Every learner will be provided with the opportunity to achieve proficiency in Reading, Mathematics, Writing and Science.

#### Objective(s):

Based on data from current standardized achievement tests which is not yet available, maintain positive proficiency rates in Reading, Language, Math, and Science. Use baseline scores to set goals for maintaining or increasing proficiency levels.

#### Goal 2

Students will receive quality instruction and learning experiences by highly-qualified trained teachers. Montessori information is offered to parents.

#### Objective(s):

Increase the number of teachers and support teachers with some Montessori training to 100%. Increase the number of teachers with Common Core State Standards training to 100%. Increase the percentage of parents who have had some Montessori training and some State Standards training to 50%.

#### Goal 3

Enhancement of our school's programs that encourage a child's respect for self, others, community and the world as in our school's mission statement.

#### Objective(s):

Less classroom behavior issues and fewer referrals to the Principal for disciplinary reasons.

### School Communication Efforts

The main communication for parents is from their child(ren)'s teachers by weekly newsletters and frequent emails and phone calls. In addition, the administrative office maintains a website and a Facebook page and sends email messages to parents for school-wide information as well as producing a monthly school-wide newsletter. Also, with Infinite Campus, we are utilizing the communication tools that are available in this program. Parent/Teacher conferences are held a minimum of twice/year. Since parents are responsible for transporting their children to school each day, many impromptu conferences happen on a daily basis. The PTO also maintains a private website and sends emails to all parents that have actively registered on the website about special events for families. Parents and community members are invited to many special activities that focus on student learning. These include classroom orientations, International Children's Day, Parent-Child Night, Peace Walk/Week Activities, Moving-up Night, Science and/or Social Studies Fair, Book Fair, Open House, and individual class presentations.
